PUBLIC POLICY PRIORITIES

Mosaic envisions a world where people with intellectual disabilities thrive as valued participants in their communities.



MEDICAID

- → Provide sufficient federal and state funding so individuals can receive appropriate services and supports in communities of their choosing.
- → Allow consumers to direct their own services and have those services provided in the community.
- → Coordinate federal and state programs to promote community living, including shared living and affordable, accessible housing.
- → Shift funding from institution-based settings to community-based programs and services.
- → Increase funding to promote the use of technology to assist in delivering quality services and supports.



LONG-TERM SERVICE AND SUPPORTS (LTSS)

- → Promote person-centered planning and selfdirected services in community-based settings.
- Design Managed Long Term Services and Supports (MLTSS) to implement personcentered practices capable of addressing the diverse needs of all people with intellectual disabilities on an individualized basis.
- → Improve access to programs for people with intellectual disabilities by providing funding to eliminate waiting lists and provide comprehensive services to those who are underserved.
- → Promote an array of community-based living options and services through LTSS funding structures.
- → Provide appropriate funding and transition supports to comply with the *Olmstead* decision.



SOCIAL SECURITY

- → Increase resource limits to allow people with disabilities to work, save, and plan for their future.
- → Design and fund income supports to reflect of the actual costs of living, working, and socializing in the community.



EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT

- → Adopt policies that promote inclusive education and provide necessary supports for a free, appropriate public education.
- → Provide sufficient funding for transition services and programs that strive for competitive employment or meaningful days if employment is not an option.













HOUSING

- → Provide adequate funding so affordable and accessible housing can be found to ensure people can choose where they live and have privacy in their own home.
- → Ensure HUD policies are complimentary to other federal policies and programs.



INDIVIDUAL CHOICE

→ Protect the rights of people with intellectual disabilities to fully participate in their community and to decide where they live and work.

STATE LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

SUPPORT STAFF WAGES

- → Ensure that funding allows staff to earn a living wage and appropriate benefits.
- → Implement Medicaid reimbursement rates that cover the increasing costs of compensation and other workforce initiatives.

PROVIDER REIMBURSEMENT RATES

 Establish Medicaid reimbursement rates that reflect the costs of providing quality services and supports in community-based settings.

REDUCE WAITING LISTS

Increase funding to ensure that all people with intellectual disabilities receive comprehensive services in communitybased settings.

COMMUNITY LIVING

- Maximize federal programing and funding opportunities to provide affordable and accessible housing in communities for people with intellectual disabilities.
- → Promote using shared living arrangements (like host homes or extended family homes) to provide community-based residential services.

COMMUNITY-BASED EMPLOYMENT

→ Fully implement provisions of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) help people with disabilities make the transition from school programs to having competitive, integrated employment and meaningful days in a community of their choosing.
